'Daily Bridge in New Zealand' sent to inboxes Tuesday 23 July featured Richard Soloman's accolade for Mt Maunganui Club's 20 July successful tournament.

Richard singles out a board which proved too hard for all, bar one pair in the Intermediate and Junior events. (Board 12 morning session if you want to look).

The first problem came in what to open the West hand with 21pts (singleton K). East had 9pts, 2 Aces.

Some pairs missed their spade fit and played in no-trumps. If West had opened 2NT (a possibility), East should bid 3 transfer and then 3 ver the 3 response. The spade fit should still be found.

6 pairs found 6NT impossible to make (only 10 tricks in that contract) while 3 more were unsuccessful in 6. Most of the rest played in 4. or 3NT but only one pair made 12 tricks in spades.

However, top of the pack were local "Mount" pair **Dianne Beveridge** and **Michele Rogers** who bid and made 6 after receiving a diamond lead ... and they were in the Junior event.

Good bidding and good play from that pair and all up a good and encouraging day for one of our more proactive clubs.
