Changes to Incorporated Societies – change in Legislation that affects OUR CLUB

<u>Summary:</u> In 2022 a new Incorporated Societies Act was passed by the government, updating the previous act from 1908!! In Oct/Nov 2023 all the details around the new Act became agreed, and quantities of information on requirements can be accessed through the Incorporated Societies Website.

Existing societies (like the Mt Bridge Club) will need to re-register under the Incorporated Societies Act 2022 before **April 2026** if they want to remain as an incorporated society.

Our constitution needs some changes in order to comply with the above. These amendments / changes need to be ready for the AGM in Feb 2025 for discussion/ objections to give us as much time as possible. Then we need to start with the reregistration which may have setbacks if we have not covered all the bases. So, we need to make a start now.

The Committee plans to take us all on a journey, step by step. It will not be in email form, rather in writing on a designated board in the teaching room. But will be happy to send info or answer questions by emails. All interaction will be welcome. Watch that space.
