It was the Club's Xmas party and needless to say - The Punch and the season had made us quite gay Now we're just raw novices, my partner and me - We've only been playing six months you see When I checked our positions, I went dry in the mouth - We'd been assigned table one – North and South With two grand masters sitting East and West - All that we'd learned would be put to the test We took our positions and said not a word - But I'm certain our heartbeats could surely be heard We'd been to some lessons, so although I was green - I knew that to open you had to have thirteen I sorted my hand and counted but alas - With only ten points – I had to pass And frankly – I thought this a shame - As I'd never before had 13 Spades in a game! My left hand opponent, a big name in the city - Opened two clubs and I thought what a pity My partner, South, who was trembling with fear - Bid two hearts in print very clear My righthand opponent sat straight in his chair - 3 Diamonds he chose to declare Now I had a fair suit, but alas - With no help in her suit I had to pass My left hand opponent now bid three spades - You can imagine how much I was amazed South bid four hearts and now I feared – That I can't play her suit if I end up on lead My right hand opponent studied his hand and soon six No Trumps was his command It was my turn to bid – and just to save face– the next three bids were pass, pass, pass I was ready to lead a spade but alas – my partner got it wrong and led the heart king A lead out of turn – what a terrible thing! The director was called and L can still hear his yoice – as he told the declarer he make his own choice			there were 135 tables which presented some logistical problems.
