In a novice game a player leads a low club and partner alerts. They ask about the alert. Reply -"They are leading a singleton." "How do you know", one opponent asks. "Because they led it with the left hand. If it were from a doubleton, it would have been led it with the right hand."

Member is playing with a partner who never knows what to bid. Imagine the chagrin when a hand is picked up with 7 clubs and 6 diamonds. Rather than figure out how to describe the hand, member puts one suit in one hand and the other suit in the other hand and promptly lets partner play 3S.
