There has been a complaint concerning bad manners at the Bridge table at our Club and as your President it is my duty to set out a few pointers to remind us how to conduct ourselves at the bridge table.

GOOD MANNERS.

Express greetings on arriving at at table and a thank you on departing. Dummy should not make a suggestion or claim. Do not give unasked advice or tuition at table

COURTESY.

Applies to how you relate to partner, opponent and Director if he or she is called. Remember the Director is your friend but it does not mean he or she will always rule in your favour. Do not openly criticize partner or opponent.

MANNERISMS.

Avoid meaningful eye contact, sighs or grimaces. Snapping cards down on the table because of frustration can also cause irritation to others. Be careful not to communicate information to players who have not played the board. Some of us have acute hearing.

remind us of Marty Bergen's RULES FOR BEING A GOOD PARTNER.

- Do not give lessons unless you are being paid to do so.
- Never say anything to your partner unless you would want them to say the same to you.
- Never criticise your partner for a normal action just because it didn't work this time.
- 4. Uness your intent is to clear up a misunderstanding, avoid discussing the hand just played. If you cannot resist, be discreet.
- 5. Remember that you and your partner are on the same side.
- Do not forget your partner wants to win as much as you do.
- If you feel the urge to be nasty, sarcastic, critical or loud, excuse yourself and take a walk.
- When there is time between hands, do not discuss bridge.
- When you want to consult another player about a disaster, ask about your hand, not your partner's.
- *to.* Do not ever criticise or embarass your partner in front of others.
