ever wondered what those 'A' 'B' or 'C' points are?

Most bridge sessions played at both club and tournament level of affiliated clubs are played for I Master Points. If you finish in approximately the top third of your field, you will receive Master Points. Master Points are only awarded to events run by an affiliated club, Region or NZBridge. There are three categories of Master Point awards:

A POINTS Awarded to players who finish in the top placings of approved A point tournaments along with winners of all session of Pairs Tournaments and fractional A points to the winners of each match I in Match-Play (teams).

B POINTS Awarded to players who finish in the top placings of approved B point tournaments along with winners of all session of Pairs Tournaments. B points cannot be converted into A points.

C POINTS appear as numbers next to the first 3 or 4 successful players in a weekly event. What does all this mean? Awarded to players who finish in the top placings of approved one session C point events. C Points are earned by players who finish in the top third placings of each club or I tournament session (in each direction if a Mitchell style movement is played).

C Points are converted to B Points in the ratio of 100 C Points to one B Point. The main objective of I these is to measure and record the achievements of players of duplicate bridge in clubs affiliated to I the New Zealand Association. KEEP COLLECTING!
