Moving back again was once again a big job. We were stunned by our members turning out in big numbers to help with the move and the setting up of the room. There are so many unsung heroes who willingly and financially gave to the bridge club. lastly on 24/9 the bridge club had our own celebration with lunch, bubbles and drawing for partners. I learnt something that day, bubbles and playing bridge with someone you haven't played with before was fun. I heard a long time member tell his partner he had 5 aces!!

I consider the new club rooms are well and truely ready for many years of great bridge.

On Grahams return he assisted Pamela and Megan. Thank you to you all, you did a great job as we got 11 permanent new members from the lessons. This coming year we will be offering day time lessons on a Wednesday for those who don't like going out at night. We currently have 268 members. We had 29 resignation (51 in 2021) for various reasons. We wish you well and know you will be missed, and 29 new members, 11 from lessons, 9 home and 9 affiliated members. A big welcome to all our new members. Thursday bridge is now going well, not sure if it is the bridge or the wine at end of play!

Friday numbers have declined, we would like to see an increase in numbers there. Our existing honours board is too heavy for the wall in the new club, so Michelle Larnder has come up with a digital board. Thank you Michelle. We presented the inaugural trophy in remembrance of Karen Martiletti for the Wed singles champ. This went to Pamela Pederson. Congratulations Pamela. We now have our H & S policy and Fire evacuation plan. These are found on our web site under club policies. I presented this to every session in one week so I hope you are all familiar with this. If you feel you would like a refresher please let me know. We have found it a constant struggle to get sponsors during these troubled times we are experiencing. The committee have agreed on the following prize list. 3 week comp. 3 free sessions, 2 week comp, 2 free lessons, 3 week singles 3 free sessions and runner up to get 2 free sessions.
