

#### We members are privileged to share insights from impact player MIKE RUDD

Mike, always ready to share a meaningful quip with opponents and partner alike writes ....


Seems to me there are only two main types of card games. The "set collection games" like poker, rummy, happy families, canasta, cribbage, brag and snap; and 'trick taking games" like whist (different variants), 500, Bezique, pinochle and of course bridge. Of all of these games my belief is that bridge is the one that is so absorbing, to the point of addiction, that once it has been sampled the other card games rarely feature at all in a card players attention.

Like many of the post-war baby-boomer generation my childhood memories include card games played with family and friends. My grand mother was a fanatical player and attendee of whist drives and my parents regularly played canasta, cribbage and whist with their friends in our house. I remember having moved from UK to New Zealand with my parents in the early 60's playing 500 at my school, Otahuhu College. So I reckon that turning to bridge in adulthood was a pretty seamless and natural move.

The early days of my bridge career happened in 1971 in RAF Little Rissington in the English Cotswolds where I was learning to be a flying instructor. There was a more or less permanent bridge game going in the corner of the crewroom played in a casual rotation system by pilots between flights. I had never played or had any preparation but one day one of the more mature (probably late 20s!) officers told me to make up the 4 and there it was - hooked! It was called crewroom bridge (aka kitchen contract bridge) no bidding or playing guidelines or conventions. The approach (a bit like the flying) was "seat of the pants", supplemented by WFITA (wet finger in the air), assisted by TLAR (that looks about right) and fuelled by testosterone to ensure ludicrous overbidding and cut throat play. I honed these techniques some years later on a loan tour flying from HMS Ark Royal (strike aircraft carrier) where the evenings in the Ward Room (officers' mess) were spent after dinner and lubricated suitably playing bridge using the same "systems".

It was to be over 30 years later that I tried my luck at "proper" (duplicate) bridge in the Clifton Bridge Club in UK. Unsurprisingly my early sessions proved somewhat of a shock (not just to me). I could play the cards pretty well but I had no knowledge at all of how to participate properly in the bidding auction or the etiquette guidelines which were very different from what I had been used to! My current partners might well say that is still the case. So I became a support teacher on a beginners course which taught me what i needed to know and, eventually, qualified as an English Bridge Union teacher.

Having re-emigrated back to New Zealand 5 years ago and joined the Mount Maunganui Bridge Club - a superbly run club with brilliant premises and a great membership group. I fear that my unconventional start to the game still lingers and I suffer from occasional bouts uncontrollable overbidding but I love the game and the sociability of the Club.
