Our Brookies have been to learn how to bid Slams using Gerber (4C and 5C). This system is widely used, but not taught by NZ Bridge. It allows the player to get more information about partner's hand before committing to Slam and also gives space to pull out of Slam at the 5 level if necessary. The Brookies have bid, played and practised Slams so don't under-estimate the skills of our new players!
