Hawera Convention – An illegal (tongue-in-cheek) convention used against one's opponents to claim a fouled hand. Reithoffer was the President of the Austrian Federation hosting the actual tournament. After the accusation was discreetly presented without a formal inquiry, the pair agreed

never to play in a major tournament again. Victor Mollo wrote of the 1957 incident and he and his publisher were sued but settled out-of-court.
